

## ATV TRAIL MILES BY COUNTY

Adams – Dyracuse Mound Motorcycle Rec. Area (60 acres) – Two ATV courses  
20 miles of trail in spring, summer and fall (s.s.f.) 59.9 miles winter

Ashland- Chequamegon/Nicolet National Forest – Dead Horse Run  
56 miles s.s.f. 60 miles winter  
Tri-County Recreation Corridor – Ashland to Superior = 62 miles

Barron – 30 acre ATV Park, 1 ½ blocks to Cattail Trail parking  
10.1 miles – Cattail Trail (old railroad)  
9.8 miles Wild River Trail  
.8 mile Almena City Trail to Amery to Cattail  
20.7 miles – winter ATV trails

Bayfield – Portwing, Tri-County, Valhalla, BattleAxe trail (connected)  
64.3 miles. s.s.f. Buckskin Trail 16 miles s.s.. 149.2 miles winter;  
USDA Forest Service (Washburn Ranger District) = 84.8 miles s.s.f

Burnett- 52 miles s.s.f. 109 miles winter

Chippewa – 15 miles

Clark- 166 miles s.s.f. 183.9 miles winter  
Also 3 ATV intensive use areas; Bald Peak Forest Road; Gorman; Koehler's Ford Forest Rd.

Fond Du Lac city – ATV park

Dodge- Wild Goose Trail  
20 miles winter

Douglas - Sanders grade, Gandy Dancer= 39 miles; Wild River Trail = 47 miles  
Osauge Trail = 5 miles paved along Lake Superior in town of Superior 295.8 miles winter

Eau Claire – 17 miles to Buffalo River Trails; Buffalo River Trail = 36 miles; 4 miles Channey trail to  
Town of Wilson routes. 16.4 miles winter; Village of Fairchild has ATV intensive use area

Florence – ATV intensive use area, Fisher Lake Park  
150 miles trails and routes – to be currently increased in Nicolet Forest

Forest – 8 miles

Iron – Mercer to Hurley to Saxon, includes Iron Horse Trail  
115 miles s.s.f. 450 miles winter (snowmobile trails)

Jackson – Black River State Forest = 98 miles

Kenosha – 6 miles

Kewaunee – 20 mile ATV park

Lafayette - 18 miles s.s.f. connects to Cheese County Trail = 64 miles (47 mile railroad grade from  
Mineral Point to Darlington to Monroe and 17 miles to Pecatonica)

Langlade – Parrish Highlands Trail = 64.5 miles; 532 miles winter

Lincoln – Harrison Hills Trail = 40 miles connected to Parrish Highlands and connects to Village of Gleason; 197 miles winter

Marathon - 25 miles s.s.f. 689.7 miles winter

Marinette – ATV Park in Athelstein area and in Pembine area  
204 miles s.s.f. 232 miles winter

Oneida – Enterprise Trail = 16 miles round trip and connects to Parrish Highlands and Harrison Hills trails  
Little Rice/Lynne Trails = 16 miles wooded trail (23 miles of connecting roads and 76 miles of open town roads)

Oconto – 80 miles

Polk – 36 miles on Cattail, Clear Lake and Sommers Lake; 26 miles winter

Price – Tuscobia Trail to Birchwood, (railroad grade) 63 miles s.s.f. 108 miles winter

Rusk – 19.5 miles s.s.f.

Sawyer – Flambeau River State Forest = 38 miles; USDA Forest Service has Dead Horse Run = 79.4 miles s.s.f. these trails connect to Flambeau Trail System in Chequamegon = 70 miles and connect to Tuscombia out of Price. Minong Trail = 20 miles and connects to Wild River in Washburn Cty.

Shawano – Village of Tigerton, Embarrass River ATV Park (500 acres) = 20 miles  
539 miles winter

Taylor – 13.3 miles s.s.f. Chequamegon Forest – Perkinstown = 22 miles s.s.f.  
291 miles winter

Washburn – Wild Rivers State Trail = 74.1 miles s.s.f. 107.5 miles winter

Wood – Seneca intensive use area

Conclusion: 2017.2 trail miles s.s.f.  
4129.7 trail miles winter (4129.7-1893.2 = 2236.5 adjusted winter miles or additional miles to s.s.f)

\*Routes must be added because they form an extensive part of most trail systems.

On the conservative side route miles = 2X trail miles

2017.2 x 2 = 4034 miles and routes s.s.f

2236.5 x 2 = 4473 miles and routes winter

. 8507 total miles and routes in Wisconsin
